EMMA TURNER SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP 2024**

Soroptimist International of Pottstown is an international volunteer service organization for women in business, management and the professions. We contribute time and financial support to Pottstown community based projects making the lives of women and girls better in our local community and throughout the world.

In keeping with our mission statement, Soroptimist International of Pottstown is offering a **\$2,500.00** college scholarship to a 2023 female senior student. Our Senior Scholarship will be awarded to the most qualified female applicant based on her service and activities; personal and educational goals; **2 letters of recommendation and a typewritten essay**. As part of the guidelines of the Senior Scholarship, the award will be paid directly to the accredited college for tuition purposes.

The basic **eligibility requirements** are:

1. Senior female student
2. Attends a high school located in the 19464 or 19465 areas (Pottstown);
and resides in Montgomery or Chester county
3. Cumulative 3.00 or higher grade point average (or equivalent)
4. Applying to or accepted into a 2-yr (associate degree) or 4-yr
(baccalaureate degree) program
5. Maximum family income: \$90,000.00

The enclosed **application** is to be completed.

The **essay** should be 1-2 typewritten pages discussing the following:

- How can I be a future role model or mentor for other women and girls?
- How will this award help me to accomplish this goal?

Eligible applicants must submit the following:

- a. completed application**
- b. an official high school transcript**
- c. typewritten essay**
- d. two (2) letters of recommendation from teacher, counselor, pastor, etc.**
